Activities Combating Chronic Malnutrition



Prenatal Care

Our prenatal program provides ongoing assistance to expectant families.

- **In-home consultations with healthcare professionals**
- **Transportation to the hospital for delivery**
- **Fertilizer assistance to increase agricultural output**



San Yves Nutrition Center

We collaborate and co-fund the nutrition center with the Yoro community to address current chronic malnutrition.

- **24-hour care by trained professional staff**
- **Nutritional support for severely malnourished children**
- **Regular follow up for children in their homes after they recover**



Measuring Our Impact in 2022



28%
increase in
births in-hospital

Our baseline data showed 46% of children from communities we work with were born in hospitals. Our prenatal program provides education on the benefits of giving birth in a hospital and provides transportation for women when they go into labor.

Since the start of our program, 74% of births in participating communities have taken place in a hospital.



34%
increase in
agricultural output

Small plot farmers receive small in-kind grants of fertilizer from NutriFund to increase their output. The growth they saw in total grain harvested last year had an immediate, tangible impact on nutrition in the homes we work with. It means more beans and tortillas on the table, as well as increased income to purchase other foods if they have enough grain to sell.

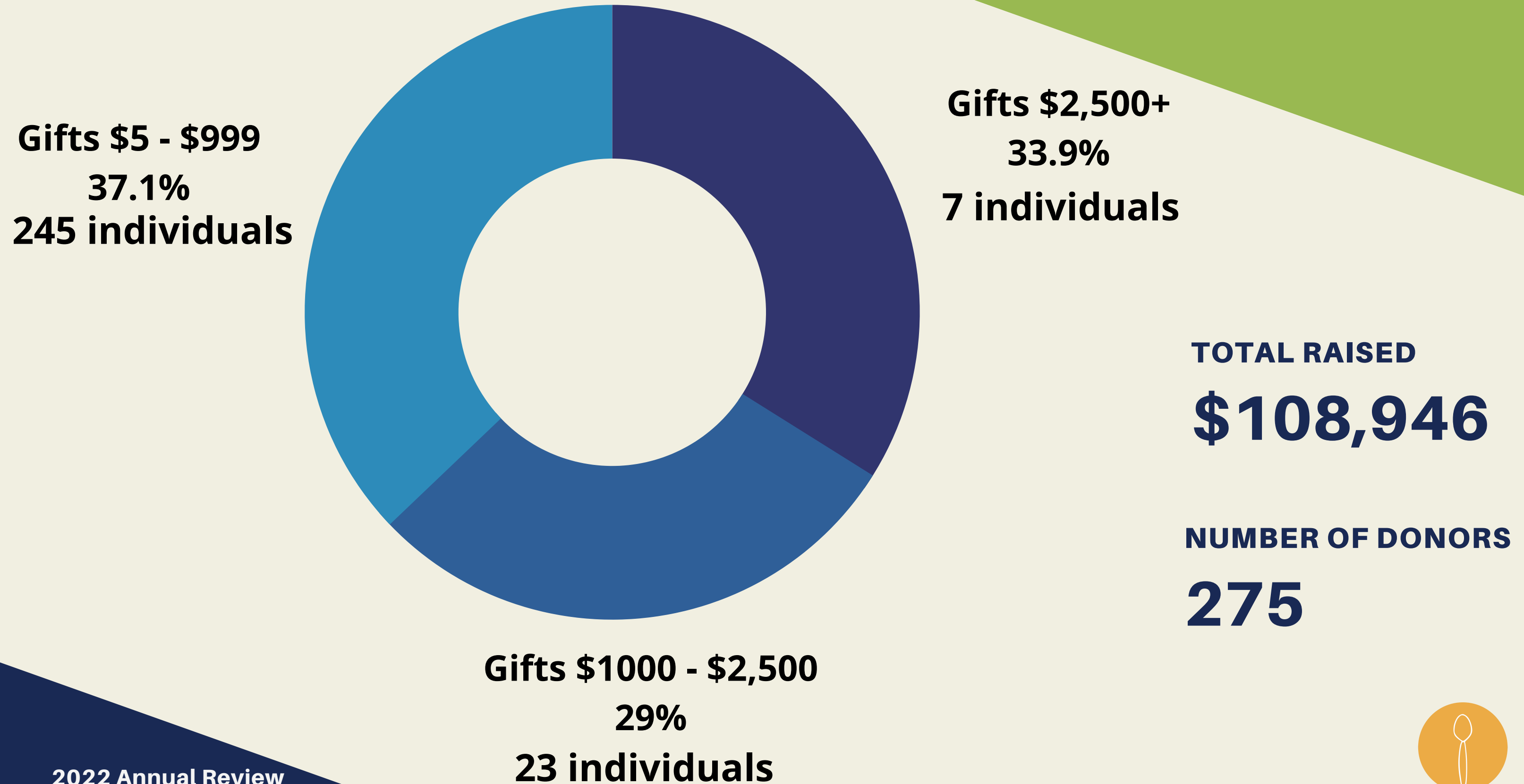

2022 Prenatal Budget

Following a successful pilot of our program in 2021, we significantly expanded: increasing from 1 community and 40 women to 8 communities and 300+ women.



STAFF
\$25,109

Two full-time and two part-time staff routinely visit households to build trust and relationships with the participating communities. They discuss the importance of prenatal care and nutrition and encourage women to take advantage of the services we offer. They also collect data and track all pregnancies, ensuring women receive the care they need.

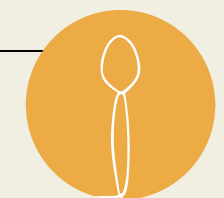
We provide free access to any care needed for the duration of a pregnancy, including:

- Vitamins and medicines
- Appointments with OBGYN and ultrasounds
- Birth in hospital and related supplies
- Transportation for appointments and birth



AGRICULTURE
\$14,725

We look to stimulate economic growth and improve food security, both key to sustainably combating malnutrition. We provide zero-interest in-kind agricultural loans to farmers who pay it back after their harvest. This program is self-sustaining as revenue from repayments covers the cost of loans for the next growing season.



Impact of the Prenatal Care Program

Sofia is a 16-year-old mother; her second child was due in February. Her first pregnancy occurred before our program began in her community. She had no prenatal care for its duration. When we met her, her child was malnourished.

While expecting her second child, she received support from our program including vitamins, visits with a physician and ultrasounds.

Her son was born at the hospital on February 10th weighing 6lbs 10oz and measuring 19.6 inches, a perfectly healthy baby!

2022 Nutrition Center Grant

NutriFund provides a grant to the San Yves Nutrition Center, our local partner in Yoro. This covers about half of their operating costs, while they locally raise the other half.

24-hour childcare for 15 -20 kids requires people. Our support contributed to the employment of 11 full-time and two part-time staff.



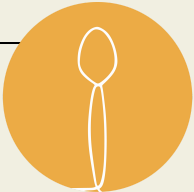
FOOD AND MEDICINE
\$11,964

A locally sourced, well balanced diet forms the basis from which children in care grow. We funded specialized medical care for 4 children, including a life-changing leg surgery for one of the babies that would otherwise never have been able to walk!



OPERATIONS
\$7,625

Keeping the lights on, operating a 24/7 site means paying electricity, gas, maintenance, etc. We also funded the construction of an outdoor play area for the kids to spend their days!

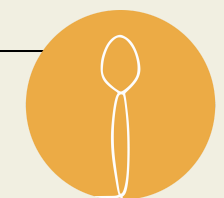


Impact of the San Yves Nutrition Center



Kids who arrive to the center have nowhere else to go. They often arrive at the local hospital life-threateningly sick and have their immediate symptoms cured. But their underlying malnutrition goes untreated. They face dire consequences if they return home.

Alberto did not receive proper care at home and arrived at the nutrition center after a short stint in the hospital. He was almost 12 months old and weighed only 12 pounds. He could not sit upright and wasn't able to do more than lay around crying. After three months in the nutrition center, he is getting back on track! Without the nutrition center, he would have been sent back home after being in the hospital for a few days and best case scenario would be in the same position that we met him in three months ago. The nutrition center fills a significant gap in long-term care availability.



Looking forward

We're incredibly excited to continue to grow and improve our programming in 2023 by building on our success over the past two years.

Our prenatal program will expand to provide care to both moms and newborns through the first six months of life. Specifically, we intend to focus on the importance of breastfeeding and dieting for mom, as well as ensuring newborns have access to regular medical care and vaccination.

We are filled with hope and optimism in 2023, knowing that we have such dedicated and compassionate supporters by our side. Thank you again for all that you do to make this work possible.
